

Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) Low-Income Board Member Certification

To be certified as a CHDO, a minimum of 1/3 of the board must consist of representatives of the community being served by the CHDO. One of the ways to meet this requirement is have board members from "low income" households. Low income is defined as an annual gross household income less than or equal to 80% of the area median income. See the chart below for the income limit that applies to your household:
