

Instructions for using the US Census Bureau’s American Fact Finder website for HOME Site and Neighborhoods Standards reviews:

Go to <http://factfinder2.census.gov/faces/nav/jsf/pages/index.xhtml>

To find census tract for the project site:

Select geographies (on the left side)

Select the “address” tab and enter the address of the project (including zip code). Print out the results and then close that window.

To find information on race and ethnicity for the census tract:

Select geographies (on the left side)

Select the “name” tab. Under the “geography filter options” expand “geographic type” and select “census tract”.

Expand “within state” and select “Vermont”.

Expand “within county” and select the county where the project is located.

Expand “within census tract” and enter the census tract number of where the project is located.

Under the “Results” section of the window, click on your selection (“Census Tract XXX, XXX County, Vermont”). This will get added to the search criteria under “your selection” on the left side of the page.

Then select “topics” on the left side, and expand “people”, then expand “race and ethnicity” and click on “race/ethnicity of individual”. This will also get added to the search. Close the “select topics” window.

Click on the QT-P3 report “Race and Hispanic or Latino Origin: 2010”. Print page.

To find information on race and ethnicity for the State as a whole:

Select geographies (on the left side)

Select the “name” tab. Under the “geographic filter options” expand “geographic type” and select “state”. Under the “Results” section of the window, click on “Vermont” (on page 2). This will get added to the search criteria under “your selection” on the left side of the page.

Then select “topics” on the left side, and expand “people”, then expand “race and ethnicity” and click on “race/ethnicity of individual”. This will also get added to the search. Close the “select topics” window.

Click on the QT-P3 report “Race and Hispanic or Latino Origin: 2010”. Print page.

To determine whether the census tract is an area of minority concentration:

Compare the percentages for each of the race categories for the census tract to the percentages for the State as a whole. If the tract has a population of any race or ethnicity that is 2X or more the presence in the State as a whole, the census tract meets the definition of an “area of minority concentration”.
